Our History in Durham



1895: Watts Hospital opened as a private facility with 22 beds.

1901: Lincoln Hospital opened to serve Durham's African American community.

1976: Durham County General Hospital opened, uniting the historically segregated hospitals.

1990: Durham County General Hospital became Durham Regional

Hospital to reflect the growing number of patients arriving from counties beyond Durham.

1998: A partnership formed with Duke University Health System.

2013: Durham Regional Hospital became Duke Regional Hospital.

2020 onward: Team members respond to a global pandemic, navigate major hospital construction and expand clinical services.
